BREARLEY HOUSE The Fund-Raising Committee of the Historical Society has been actively working on securing funding for the restoration of the Brearley House which is owned by Lawrence Township. In April, 1996, Town Council asked the Society to raise \$175,000. The Fund-Raising Committee is excited to report that funds totaling \$170,200. (as of this writing) have been raised. A report was made to Town Council on December 16, 1996.
